School teams across the region are invited to come together to explore how to help students ask their own questions using the Question Formulation Technique, a powerful tool developed by the Right Questions Institute.

Just when you think you know all that you need to know, you ask another question and discover how much more there is to learn. (a sixth grade student quoted on rightquestion.org)

Participants, led by Luke Baselack (Mount Vernon), Kaelyn Bullock (Shoreline), and Elaine Brouwer will have the opportunity to experience and practice the **QFT** with fellow educators in grade level or school groups.

What is QFT?

This is another tool in the toolkit to engage students around a topic in the beginning, middle, or end of a unit.

The Question Formulation Technique (QFT) is a simple step-by-step yet rigorous process that facilitates the asking of many questions. The process includes:

- 1. Teacher generates a **Question Focus** (QFocus)
- 2. Students are given the **Rules for Producing Questions**
- 3. Students engage in **Producing Questions**
- 4. Students engage in **Categorizing Questions**
- 5. Students engage in **Prioritizing Questions**
- Teacher and students discuss How the Questions will be Used
- 7. Students **Reflect** on the process
